About the speaker

The 2018 BeNA Lecture will be given by David Neumark, Ph.D. He is Chancellor’s Professor at University of California, Irvine, where he directs the Economic Self-Sufficiency Policy Research Institute (ESSPRI). He is also a Visiting Scholar at the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco and an IZA Research Fellow.

Professor Neumark uses microeconomic methods to answer applied, policy-relevant questions on labor economics. In previous work he has focused, e.g., on minimum wages, worker’s compensation, and workforce segregation. He has published in numerous leading journals, such as the *American Economic Review*, the *Quarterly Journal of Economics*, the *Review of Economics and Statistics*, the *Journal of Political Economy* and the *Journal of Labor Economics*.
